

Dear Residents and Interested Parties,

• The Town Council preliminary election results this morning are that Brian Foley and Sam Carroll will be sworn in on November 19th at 8:30 as your newly elected council members, serving a 4 year term. Please congratulate them when you see them! Former Vice Mayor Mike Ochsner and former Councilman Dick Haverland will be recognized for their dedicated service at the Regular Council meeting at 9 am on the 19th.



- The **East sidewalk** on A1A will only be installed between Beachcomber Lane and the Northern end of the Village Shops, and **bike lanes will be** wider following public input at the November 1st meetings. The speed limits remained as they are.
- RECYCLING 1: The reason we have gone to the new large recycling carts is this: The <u>State of Florida</u> mandated that recycling be increased to 75% for all counties over 100,000 in population. The Town, to help the County meet this goal, instituted a <u>mandatory recycling ordinance</u> this summer. Your cooperation and understanding are greatly appreciated.
- **RECYCLING 2:** Rumors that the **TRUCK** is the side-loader that will break branches in our beautiful tree canopy is **false.** The **same** back-load **trucks that have been servicing** your neighborhood for recycling will *continue to* operate.
- We have volunteer opportunities! The Police-Fire Pension Board (Council-appointed position), Finance Committee
 (alternate position) and Code Enforcement Board (3 positions) all have openings. Please check the Boards & Committees page on the Town's website.
- This Saturday the Indian River Land Trust and Pelican Island Audubon Society will host the first Birding Tour of the season at Bee Gum Point at the bend on Fred Tuerk Drive at 7 am. www.irlt.org This 111 acre wetland features a 1.5 mile sandy trail that touches the Lagoon and interior wetlands, most enjoyable with binoculars, cameras and zoom lens.
- **RED Tide** is gone from our area! The total poundage of dead fish removed in Indian River County was over 160,000 pounds, the grant the County received for the cleanup was over \$500,000, the economic impact of three weeks of closed beaches over \$1 million. Please see the attached flyer if you have a business that was financially impacted and are interested in assistance.
