AN ORDINANCE OF TOWN OF INDIAN RIVER SHORES, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE TOWN CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 101 TITLED AS "FLORIDA FRIENDLY FERTILIZER USE" AS SET FORTH HEREIN; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS, LIMITATIONS ON FERTILIZER USE AND APPLICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
