Good Afternoon Residents & Interested Parties,

The news that may be of interest to you is as follows:

- There will be a **Special Called Meeting** on Monday, February 11th at 7:55 AM for the purpose of recognizing Joe Griffin as Town Manager/CEO of the Town of Indian River Shores, as well as for a discussion and decision regarding the official members of the Collective Bargaining Committee.
- There will be a **Closed Executive Bargaining Session** on Monday, February 11th directly following the Special Called Town Council Meeting at 7:55 AM.
- The **Planning, Zoning and Variance Board** will meet on Monday, February 11th at 2 PM in Council Chambers at the Town Hall Complex to discuss a River Club Phase 2 bond request to remove protected trees and trees of special concern prior to issuance of building permits for the remaining Lots 1-10.
- There will be a **Collective Bargaining Session** on Thursday, February 14th at 11:30 AM in Council Chambers at the Town Hall Complex, which is open to the public.
- **CodeRED** - The Town's Public Safety Department is unrolling a new alert system called CodeRED that will warn users of everything from severe weather/evacuations to an accident where traffic may be diverted, to emergency Town Hall closures, by sending alerts straight to phones, cell phones and email addresses. To register, you will need to visit the Public Safety Department's website at [www.irspsd.org](http://www.irspsd.org), and scroll down to the bottom of the home page to follow the link to "CodeRED Community Notification Enrollment". From there, you will create a username and password. You will need to enter your first and last name, physical street address, city, state, zip and primary phone number. Additional numbers such as cell phone numbers may also be added, as well as email addresses. Click the box that states you have read, and understood the terms and conditions, then click "Verify Information".
- **Beaches Re-Open** - Based on satisfactory microbial water quality test results, the Florida Department of Health in Indian River County is lifting the swimming advisory that was issued on January 31, 2019 for the beach sites at South Beach, Humiston Beach, and Sexton Beach Plaza.
