Emergency Inspector Registration Framework & Post-Storm Onboarding Plan

Statutory Reference: Florida Statute Section 468.634, SB 180, and HB 803
Operational Window: 12 Months Post-Governor Declared State of Emergency

PART 1: EMERGENCY WORKFORCE ONBOARDING PROCEDURE

Pursuant to the workforce continuity provisions of the 2026 Florida legislative session, this procedure governs the emergency activation of out-of-state certified personnel within the Town of Indian River Shores.

- **Step 1** - Digital Intake Pathway: The Town IT Department shall maintain a dormant, rapid-activation electronic portal configured to ingest out-of-state credentials immediately following an emergency declaration. Paper applications are prohibited to accelerate deployment.
- **Step 2** - Verification Window: The Building Official or designee must cross-reference out-of-state licenses within 48 hours of electronic filing via national databases or home state licensing portals.
- **Step 3** - Direct Oversight Provisioning: All approved inspectors shall be provisioned temporary profiles within the Town's permitting system. These profiles must be programmatically locked to route high-liability structural redlines directly through the Indian River Shores Building Official oversight queue.
- **Step 4** - The 365-Day System Hard Stop: Profiles created under this framework must carry an immutable system metadata expiration date matching exactly 1 year from the date of the Governor's initial Executive Order.

SB 180 High-Rise & Crane Safety Enforcement Protocols

1. The 24-Hour Shutdown Rule: All tower cranes and hoisting gear active on multi-story jobsites within Indian River Shores must execute structural lockdown procedures 24 hours prior to anticipated hurricane-force winds.
2. Post-Event Recertification: No crane or hoisting system may resume active lifting operations until a Certified Engineer submits a post-storm structural integrity report to the Town Portal.
